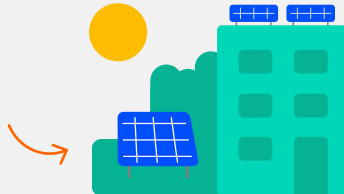
# What is Sun4All?

Sun4All is a European project, which aims at making renewable energy more accessible!

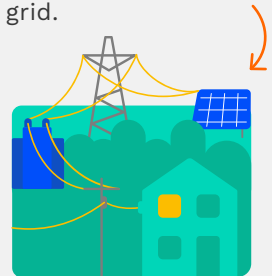
For (eligible) European citizens, participation in the project is free of charge, as it is funded by the European Union's Horizon 2020 (research and innovation) programme.

The innovative Sun4All support scheme will be tested in four pilot locations in Europe: **Almada** (PT), **Barcelona** (ES), **Coeur de Savoie** (FR) and **Rome** (IT). As part of the project, eligible households, together with local authorities and organisations, are invited to take joint actions to facilitate access to renewable energy and to improve energy consumption habits at home. Sun4All will thereby help participating families to effectively lower their energy costs.

Solar energy is generated by local photovoltaic installations, owned by the municipality and located near to where eligible participants live.



The renewable solar energy is either provided for direct consumption by Sun4All beneficiaries or fed into the local power grid.



# What does Sun4All offer for you?

The participating citizens will receive...

- free access to economic benefits of power production through local photovoltaic installations!
- advice and training on energy efficiency measures and energy management at home!
- the possibility to participate in workshops to learn more about energy bills!
- an energy efficiency starter kit for their home!
- the possibility to visit photovoltaic installations!

Sun4All beneficiaries continue to get electricity as usual, with no need to install or maintain solar panels.



Through the financial support scheme and its redistribution mechanism, Sun4All participants financially benefit from the renewable energy produced and its value.

# Who can participate in Sun4All?

Sun4All representatives are in contact with eligible project beneficiaries at each pilot location. Participation in the project, workshops, and site visits are free of charge.

Local authorities and involved organisations will inform the participants about the registration processes, upcoming events, etc.

## Being a participant – what does it mean?

Sun4All's intention is to create learning experiences for participants and everyone involved. For this purpose, participants will be given the chance to take part in information and individual advice sessions, workshops and site visits to photovoltaic installations. By participating, they will learn about renewable energy production, improvement of energy consumption at home, and energy efficiency.

Participants will receive support and detailed instructions from direct contact persons at each pilot location, who can be addressed at any time in case of questions or doubts.
